Thank you for all that we accomplished together during 2022 and 2023. **We couldn't have done it without your support!**

Following our inaugural year in 2021 in which we sponsored over a dozen Holocaust education programs, we kicked off 2022 with free live-screenings of **two**Holocaust films in partnership with the East Bay Jewish International Film Festival in March. This was followed by a free touring Holocaust art and multimedia exhibit for the public in Pleasanton and San Ramon Apr-Jun 2022, and a free Holocaust talk by Henry Michalski at the Firehouse Theater in June in Pleasanton.

For the rest of 2022, a team of over 20 volunteers helped us plan for **Violins of Hope East Bay**, which we hosted between Jan to Mar 2023, with over **60 events** which were attended by over **17,800 people.**

Violins of Hope East Bay was certainly the highlight for our young organization. The next pages describe some of our events during 2022 and 2023 and upcoming exciting programs that we are planning for 2024.



Violins of Hope is a collection of restored violins that were played by Jewish musicians during the Holocaust. These instruments have survived concentration camps, ghettos, pogroms, and many long journeys to tell remarkable stories of injustice, suffering, resilience, and survival.

Performed by Livermore-Amador Symphony (LAS) and conducted by Lara Webber with special performances by violinist Lindsay Deutsch and cellist Peter Bedrossian, these concerts moved the community. Avshi Weinstein, co-founder of Violins of Hope, provided stories for several of the instruments.

Violins of Hope Free Exhibits

January 31 - February 12, 2023

Over **1,700** people visited the exhibit at the Bankhead Theater in Livermore. The exhibit included information about the Violins of Hope project, its founders and a collection of the restored instruments along with stories of each violin. It also includes information about how music provided hope for Jewish musicians and occupants of ghettos and concentration camps during the Holocaust. Information about orchestras that were formed in many ghettos and concentration camps consisting of Jewish musicians.

Free School Assemblies

Music is Message of Hope



Working with orchestras of middle schools in the East Bay, our goal is also to also have them conduct **20** workshop sessions during the school year.




2022 By the Numbers

Sponsorships & Donations 44.7%






